## Speyside Fields for Wildlife 2020 Report

This is the fourth year of our activities. Seven sites were planted this year.

In contrast to the cold wet spring of 2019, the spring of 2020 was warm and damp. These ideal growing conditions saw the seeds germinate and grow well. With little or no frosts during September, flowers were still blooming into October and butterflies and other insects were still active on bright sunny days.

With the mild open weather continuing well into November, bird flocks only began to build up then.

By mid-December however, the weather changed and winter gripped much of the Highlands. From early January, through to mid-February, deep snow and frost covered much of the countryside and wildlife had a tough time.

Our seed crops were heavily utilised during this period and flocks of over one thousand finches were present at Mousa, Balliemore and Ballinlaggan.

Significant records are given for each site.

Our project was nominated for a Nature of Scotland award and we were awarded a Highly Commended in the Community Initiative category.

In addition to the fields established this year, we responded to numerous enquiries for advice from across UK. These ranged from people wishing to create wildlife fields, to gardeners wishing to plant mini wild flower meadows. We have also been in discussion with CNPA and HC on how best to safeguard wildflower rich roadside verges.

Thanks again to CNPA and to all our patrons and supporters for their support.



Sadly, this field was compromised when sheep were let in from mid-January and the seed crop was heavily impacted.

Other birds recorded using the fields this season or hunting the birds were: bullfinch, yellowhammer, skylark, redwing, mistle thrush, greylag geese, barn owl, kestrel, sparrowhawk, wood pigeon, stock dove, feral pigeon, rook, crow, jackdaw, whitethroat, blackbird, oystercatcher, woodcock.
